The project will include content-based professional development, face-to face and virtual coaching, classroom observations, and research-based assessments to impact student achievement. Teachers will simultaneously participate in robust STEMDesign professional learning focused on effective pedagogy that incorporates design thinking, project-based learning, and student engagement.
