We have an opportunity to explore the world outside of school right now. Play, explore, and talk with children. Ask them what they are wondering. Listen and talk about what they want to discuss. Maintain children's curiosity and ease fear by providing a steady flow of learning opportunities. Go on <u>virtual field trips</u> to places far away from home. Meet new characters in <u>digital books</u>. Learn about <u>new ideas</u> by watching television."

Georgia Virtual School offers flexible online learning options to public school, private school, and home school students. Virtual courses serve a wide array of student learning styles through interactive and engaging content.



Students can choose from two different learning options through Georgia Virtual Learning: The Georgia Virtual School provides teacher-led class-based learning; Georgia Virtual Credit Recovery allows a self-paced learning environment. The content in Georgia Virtual courses is available for anyone to view. Students can access the courses at the Georgia Virtual Shared Content page. Courses are divided into modules and are aligned with the Georgia Standards of Excellence.



The Georgia Department of Education's Georgia Standards Frameworks section is also a rich resource that offers a very clear overview of the Georgia Standards of Excellence (GSE) for various grade levels.
