Unit Description	In this unit, students combine traditional story-telling with technology to create a digital storybook about a monster. Using the book <i>El monstruo de colores</i> (<i>The Color Monster: A Pop-Up Book of Feelings</i>), students learn about emotions in Spanish and apply this knowledge to write a story of their own. Each student develops their own monster character, scripts a story about it, and designs a puppet to perform in a culminating mini-theater. Although the plan is written to teach Spanish standards, it can easily be modified to teach English Language Arts standards.
